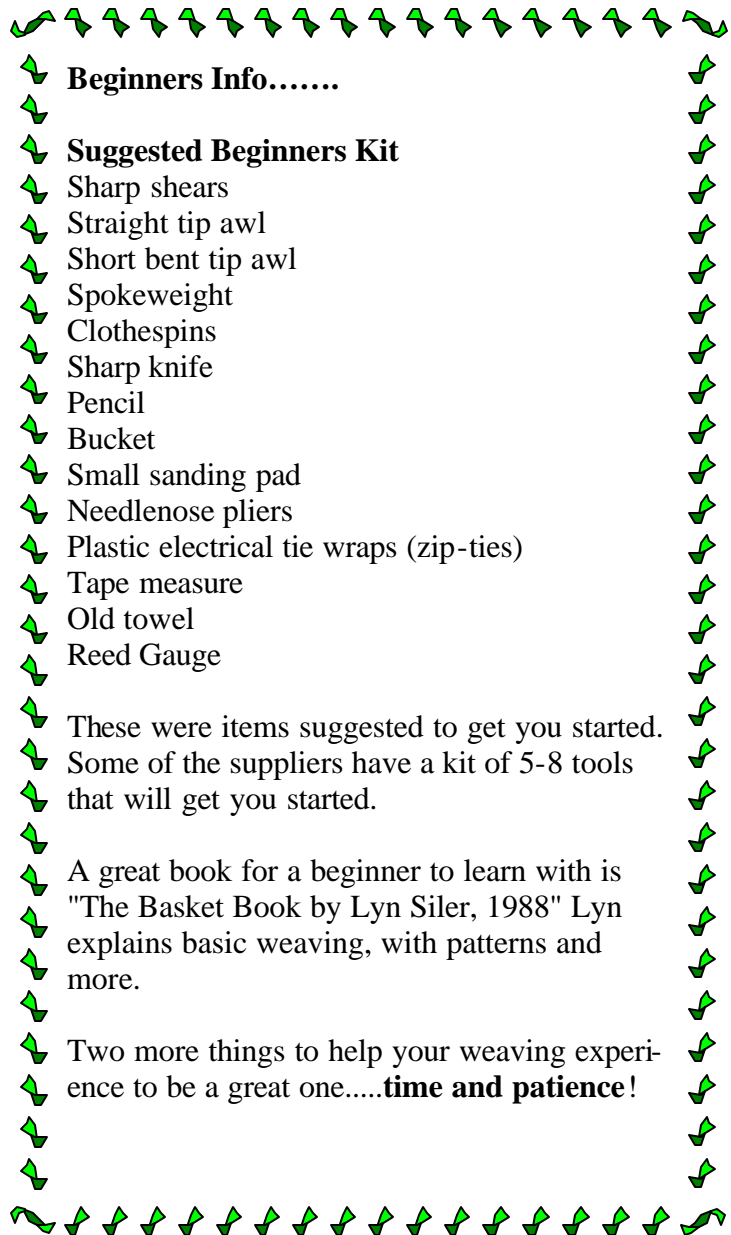

**Beginners Info.....****Suggested Beginners Kit**

- Sharp shears
- Straight tip awl
- Short bent tip awl
- Spokeweight
- Clothespins
- Sharp knife
- Pencil
- Bucket
- Small sanding pad
- Needlenose pliers
- Plastic electrical tie wraps (zip-ties)
- Tape measure
- Old towel
- Reed Gauge

These were items suggested to get you started. Some of the suppliers have a kit of 5-8 tools that will get you started.

A great book for a beginner to learn with is "The Basket Book by Lyn Siler, 1988" Lyn explains basic weaving, with patterns and more.

Two more things to help your weaving experience to be a great one.....**time and patience!**

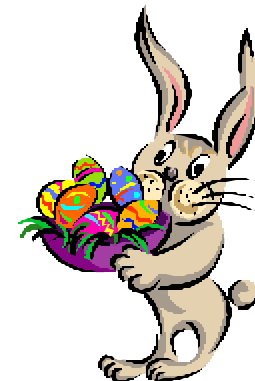

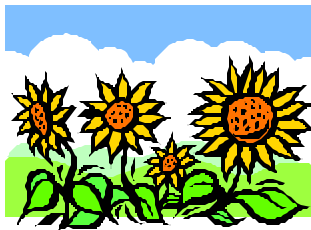
We are always looking for "a few good men" - or women. If you are interested in being a part of making GW07 "happen" let us know!

How did I start weaving? In 1982, after my husband's death, one of his faithful nurses, a weaver herself, suggested I might enjoy basketweaving. She shared some basic techniques as a starter. I struggled and continued trying off and on—not yet hooked!

How long? In '83 or '84 on a trip "home," I spied a basketry shop in nearby Hampstead, stopped in, took an instant liking to the owner—Pat Graham, who later would become one of the organizers of the NCBA. With Pat as my first real instructor, I became a collector of supplies and tools and addicted to weaving, sort of.

How did you find TBG? I joined NCBA not long after it was established and was, of course, listed in their membership roster. Subsequently came a phone call from a then-stranger Pam Jellick of the Tidewater Chapter, High Country Basketry Guild (later to become Tidewater Basketry Guild). Pam had been scanning her NCBA roster for Tidewater residents to invite to the HCBG chapter, so I grabbed my buddy Alice (Wyvill) and away we went - and we're still a-go with baskets.

Favorite type of weaving/basket? Whatever I'm going to weave next.

What else do I do? Rubberstamping, thanks to Cindy Stanton and Laura White, has become a basketweaving competitor for organization, space, and time. I wish I could stamp and weave, both at the same time! ... And I cherish visits with my daughter Polly at either her place in Palmyra, VA, or mine, and with my "foreign" family wherever I can catch them-- here, there, or yonder (currently in Poland and soon-to-be in Singapore.)

Best thing about weaving? The reward of a well-finished product.
