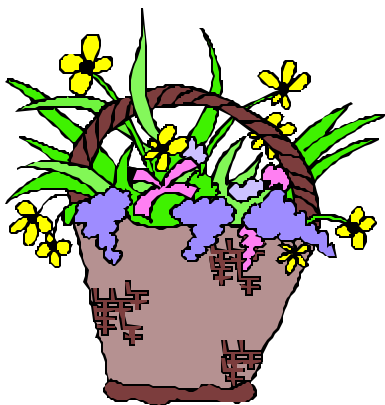

September 30th Judith was one of 40 artist in the Ocracoke's ART WALK.

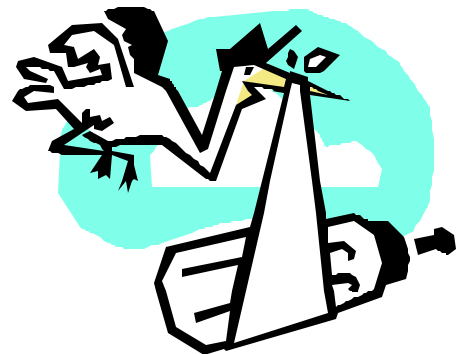
October 3rd, she demonstrated at the State Fair in Richmond for the Artisan's Center of VA

Meet Judith Saunders

Hometown: Born and raised in Norfolk, VA and now, officially, a resident of Ocracoke, NC

How did I start weaving? How long? I have been weaving for more than 25 years in great part due to my career as an art teacher. My first weaving began using a book called Basic Baskets, a small paperback by Mary Cary on working with round reed. The major influence on my current work and my enthusiasm, however, came when I took a one-week workshop at the Arrowmont School of Arts and Crafts, Gatlinburg, TN, in the early eighties with Shereen LaPlantz. It happened quite by accident. I signed up for a workshop called Cold Connections with Metals with David LaPlantz because I was teaching a metals class in a room with no ventilation. I needed a second workshop to meet my requirements for re-certification. I signed up for the Plaited Basketry workshop without knowing anything about plaited basketry. I feel so fortunate to have met and studied with both David and Shereen. They truly had a major impact on my teaching career and my personal artistic expression.

How did you find TBG? Joyce Smith and Sherral Nelson are responsible for my involvement with TBG. I wanted to take part in the January weaving weekend, which was at that time called Winter Weave. I wanted to meet and spend time with others interested in basketry.

What else do I do? I spend as much time being an Ocracoke Island, NC resident as possible. I am a "Beach Bum" at heart and I am able to spend more time weaving there. I would love to have some weaving buddies come down to weave and enjoy the winter beach.

Favorite type of weaving/basket? I like them all and can't decide which I prefer doing. I have flat reed, round reed, cane and ash and love working with all of it. I've even made other egg baskets!

What else do I do? Other than my job at Fort Eustis? Quilt, bead, read, garden, and babysit occasionally with my grandson.
